1 ACTION ITEMS:

- 1.1 Mr. Delambre explained that his firm is engaged in grant procurement and administration and so he is very familiar with both the USDA program and the vendors involved with the contracts up for consideration. They are capable and competent vendors that will perform well for FPB he believes. Mr. Delambre also confirmed that neither he nor his firm have any financial interest in any of the various service providers or the professional service contracts up for consideration at this meeting. He will receive no financial benefit from any of the contracts or the grant (if awarded) and receives nothing over and above the normal salary for any other FPB Board member. Mr. Cubine referenced discussions between Mr. Delambre and the staff attorney to this effect contained in Mr. Delambre's 2/7/24 email to the staff attorney explaining the foregoing (attached).
- 1.2 Consider Issuance of RFP 2024-1 for expansion of solar facilities at FPB Admin property.

Staff has drafted RFP 2024-1 for the Board's consideration to issue to potential bidders for expansion of the community solar facility. The request is seeking proposals to complete phases 2-4 of the existing solar array and adding additional arrays to bring the total solar capacity over 1MW. Final contract will

be contingent upon vendor's per kW pricing, necessary site improvements and available grant funding.

Kathryn Dutton-Mitchell moved to approve issuance of RFP 2024-1 for expansion of solar facilities at FPB Admin Property. Stephen Mason seconded the motion. CARRIED. 5 to 0.

1.3 Consider Award of an Environmental Assessment (EA) of the Admin Property to Shield Environmental Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$5,000.

Under the proposed agreement, Shield will provide an assessment of the environmental impacts of solar expansion at the Flynn Avenue property. The EA will support FPB's efforts to secure grant funding from the USDA.

John Snyder moved to Award Environmental Assessment of the Admin Property to Shield Environmental Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$5,000. Kathryn Dutton-Mitchell seconded the motion. CARRIED. 5 to 0.

1.4 Consider Award of a Grant Writing Contract.

Grant writer to provide assistance with completing the USDA REAP application.

Stephen Mason moved to award Grant Writing Contract for completion of the USDA REAP grant application to Earth Tools. Kathryn Dutton-Mitchell seconded the motion. CARRIED. 5 to 0.

1.5 Review and Consider Approval of REAP Feasibility Review from Moore Ventures, LLC.

1.6 Consider Archaeological Study of Admin Property to Support REAP Grant.

John Snyder moved to Authorize Archaeological Study of Admin Property to Support REAP Grant if deemed necessary. Stephen Mason seconded the motion. CARRIED. 5 to 0.
